What is Cheating and Plagiarism?

It is cheating when you....

- 1. copy a friend's homework or class work or let them copy yours. If someone asks to see your homework, tell them **NO!** Otherwise you will both receive a consequence.
- 2. look at someone's paper, notes, an open book (without permission), etc. during a test or quiz.
- 3. communicate with another student, in any fashion, during a test/quiz or outside of class about the contents of a test/quiz.

Cheating can lead to plagiarism!

It is plagiarism when you....

- 4. say the work you have is yours, when it is not.
- 5. do not cite the source when you have used other's words, sentences, music, or images in your work.
- 6. paraphrase **someone else's** thoughts, opinions, experiences or **ideas without citation**.
- 7. cut and paste from on-line sources to use as your own work (i.e. websites, quizlet)
- 8. change just a few words from a source (or a friend) and use it as your own.

Anything that is:

- Summarized
- Copied
- Paraphrased
- Borrowed
- Or using the structure of (without citation) is considered plagiarism.
